### Highlight Walkability

Kraków's UNESCO district is compact; perfect for travelers who want maximum immersion with minimal logistics.

### Connect UNESCO + Local Life

Pair historic sites with modern Kraków: cafés, street musicians, contemporary art, rooftop views, and culinary hotspots.
